- Write a brief summary of the book. Don't give away the ending!
- Explain what you like/dislike about the book.
- Answer the following questions:
 - O How important was (topic) to the plot of the book? Could (topic) have been left out without hurting the storyline?
 - O Were there any inaccuracies about (topic) in the book? If so, what were they and how could they be corrected?
 - Oculd reading this book inspire someone to take an interest in (topic)?
 - Was prior knowledge of (topic) necessary to help in understanding this book? If so, what knowledge was needed?

Directions:

No matter what your portfolio topic, someone has a career involving it! Find information about at least two career possibilities that involve your topic. Answer the following questions about each career:

- 1. What does this career involve (job duties)?
- 2. What education is needed?
- 3. What other skills are needed for this career?
- 4. How do you get started in this career?
- 5. What sort of job environment does a person in this career work in? (Outside? In an office? Travelling?)
- 6. What is the pay scale for this career?
- 7. Is this career something you would be interested in? Why or why not?

After researching each career and answering the questions above, compare the careers you have researched. What differences do you see between each career? Is one more closely tied to your topic to the other? Explain how?

You need a minimum of three references for this portfolio assignment. There is no limit on the number of references that may be a web site for this assignment, but make sure that all your information comes from reputable sources.
